# Parent Governor Opportunity



Halwin School is seeking to recruit two governors to join the local governing committee.

As an academy, we rely on a local governing committee to ensure the school remains accountable for the decisions it makes for children's education. Governors play a role in both supporting and challenging the school as it shapes education for our local community. We look to recruit people with a variety of skills to bring a diverse range of opinions to decision making.

The ideal candidate will have the ability to consider matters objectively and make informed judgements. Having an enquiring mind, the confidence to ask questions and debate issues that affect the school are also key attributes of an effective school governor.

#### What do school governors do?

Governors tend to meet 6 times throughout the year, once every half term; these meetings are usually on a Tuesday at 5.30pm and last for approximately 1.5 to 2 hours.

In order to perform this role well, a governor is expected to:

Get to know the school, including visiting the school occasionally during school hours, and gain a good understanding of the school's strengths and weaknesses;

Challenge and ask questions of senior leaders to ensure progress towards school goals;

Monitor the school's development in achieving set priorities;

Act in the best interest of the pupils and staff of the school;

Behave in a professional manner, as set down in the Governing Committee's code of conduct, including acting in strict confidence.

If you are interested in applying, or would like further information, please email the chair of governors (Ross Durkin: ross.durkin@croftymat.org) with an expression of interest. This should include your contact details and a short explanation about why you wish to become a governor at Halwin. If we have more than two candidates, we will ask you to take part in an election. The closing date for applications is Friday 8th December 2023.
