Thank you to all the parents who attended our celebration assembly this afternoon. The children enjoyed sharing some extracts from their writing with you. I hope it gave you an insight into the excellent writing they are producing in school. I've added some more photos of children's learning from this week to the newsletter. Thank you to the parents who suggested that during the Parent Meeting with our PINS advisor, Lauren Ladd, before Christmas. We are continuing to benefit from our involvement with PINs (Partnership in Neurodiversity) this year through professional development, training opportunities and free access to the upcoming PINS conference. Lauren Ladd will also be joining us again on Tuesday 11th February after school for an informal parent session where she can answer questions and give advice e.g. healthy sleep habits, behaviour, fussy eating, autism. If you are attending this session, your children can attend after-school care, free of charge.

This week, Kingfishers have been exploring Viking trade and the impact of trade across the five major routes. In English, the children have been writing their own independent Viking saga - the creativity they have demonstrated has really impressed Mrs Ellis! Well done all. This week in Music, Robins have been learning that there are different notes and they had a go at composing. The children all played two notes on the xylophones. In PSHE, Owls have been talking about their identity. They wrote some Kenning poems to share with their peers to describe themselves and what makes them unique! Well done everyone! Year 3 and 4 have also been learning how to do written multiplication, this is quite challenging and would be great if they can practise at home.

Thank you to the parents who attended the MTC Parent Workshop on Tuesday afternoon in preparation for the Multiplication Check for Y4 pupils in June. If you do not have your child's TTRS login, please let us know and we can ensure you have the details so they can practice at home.







Attendance

The updated attendance policy is available on the school website: https://halwin.croftymat.org/







School doors open at 8.40am and registration is taken at 8.45am. Children who arrive after the registration period has closed (9.05am) may be recorded with an unauthorised absence mark for the morning session.

The Government does not support parents taking children out of school, unless the school agrees this is appropriate under 'exceptional circumstances'. The DfE does not consider a need/desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure/recreation to be an exceptional circumstance. If you consider that your request for absence is exceptional you will need to complete the 'Leave of Absence Exceptional Circumstances' request form. Letters will not <u>be accepted</u>. This form should be returned to the school office at least 15 school days before the start of the absence. A response will be sent to you as soon as possible. If leave is not authorised and you nevertheless withdraw your child from school, the absence will be recorded as unauthorised absence. There is now a national threshold of 10 unauthorised sessions (equivalent to 5 school days) within a rolling 10 school week period for when a penalty notice must be considered. Under the new rules, taking your child out of school for a one-week holiday will now mean that a penalty notice must be considered. Please note the legal information below:

If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £80 if paid within 21 days or £160 if paid after this but within 28 days.

If your child is further absent from school without authorisation within any 3-year period, you will be committing a further offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices for a second offence are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of \pounds 160, payable within 28 days.

Importantly, fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, other action such as a parenting order or prosecution will be considered.

Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may also result in legal action. If you are prosecuted and attend court because your child has not been attending school, you could get a fine of up to £2,500. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs.

Absence not authorised by the school may also result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Again, Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs.

Money raised from fines is only used by the local authority to cover the costs of administering the system, and to fund attendance support. Any extra money is returned to the government.

'Parent' as set out in Section 576 of the Education Act 1996, defines parent to include: natural parents, whether they are married or not; any person or body who has parental responsibility for a child (as defined by the Children Act 1989) and; any person who, although not a natural parent, has care of a child. Having care of a child means a person with whom a child lives and who looks after a child, irrespective of what their relationship is with said child.





