It has been a busy and inspiring week at Halwin! Children across the school have been working incredibly hard on their independent writing. Both classes have published their work, which is proudly displayed on their classroom writing clipboards. I was so impressed with the rich vocabulary, handwriting and creative ideas on show – their enthusiasm for writing is wonderful.

Just like the children, our teachers have also been learning. Mrs Carr completed her annual DSL training, ensuring we continue to keep children safe at school. Mrs Ellis took part in Mastering Number training and is looking forward to implementing new strategies with Kingfishers this year. Mrs Tamblin received training to deliver de-escalation support and will be sharing this with all staff back in school to further strengthen our approaches. Our TAs are also busy with phonics and first aid training – we are proud to be a school where everyone is always learning and growing.

A heartfelt thank you to everyone who has already donated through our Amazon Wishlist. We have already started receiving packages, which is both exciting and very kind. Your support makes a real difference. Thank you also to those who have offered help or donated resources for our working party on October 4th – your generosity and time are greatly appreciated.

If you have a child due to start school in September 2026, applications are now open. Please also spread the word to friends and family who may be looking for schools – I am always happy to offer personal tours at a time that suits. For parents of our Year 6 children, please remember that secondary school applications must be submitted before 31st October.

This week, Robins Class enjoyed an afternoon making apple crumble at Forest School, linked to their text *The Gruffalo*. High winds meant it wasn't safe to cook over the open fire, so the children relocated to the Discovery Den. Mrs Ash was very impressed with how carefully they used the tools for peeling and cutting, as well as the kindness and teamwork they showed towards each other.

In school, spellings are taught daily, with a new rule introduced each Monday. Children can also practise these spellings at home via Spelling Shed. In Kingfishers Class, the children are tested through dictation each Friday, and their results are recorded in their reading records.

Finally, we would greatly appreciate parents' support in encouraging children to read regularly at home. Research shows that children who read daily are exposed to up to 1.8 million more words per year than those who do not – and this exposure has a huge impact on vocabulary, comprehension, and overall academic progress. Some evenings you might like to ask your child about their favourite part of the book so far, or discuss what they think might happen next.

Many people think the FLL is all about building Lego models, but that's just a tiny part of it. The majority of the club, which will run from October through to March on Wednesday afternoons after school with Mrs Ellis and Mrs Carr, involves:

- Researching and developing an idea to answer the annual challenge question.
- Designing, building, and coding a robot to complete a series of challenges.
- Exploring a real-world problem, asking experts, and coming up with creative solutions.
- Evaluating and iterating ideas to make them better.
- Presenting findings confidently to a panel of judges in an engaging way.

This year's theme is **Unearthed** – exploring archaeology and how people, working together with technology, uncover clues about how past generations lived, learned, and celebrated.

To take part, children will need an interest in learning new coding skills, teamwork, problem-solving, and creative thinking. The FLL embodies our school values of confidence, aspiration, resilience and enjoyment.





If so, you will need to apply for a place in a reception class in September 2026 for your child by the deadline of **15 January 2026**. The deadline for applications is 15 January 2026









Attendance



School doors open at 8.40am and registration is taken at 8.45am. Children who arrive after the registration period has closed (9.05am) may be recorded with an unauthorised absence mark for the morning session.

The Government does not support parents taking children out of school, unless the school agrees this is appropriate under 'exceptional circumstances'. The DfE does not consider a need/desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure/recreation to be an exceptional circumstance. If you consider that your request for absence is exceptional you will need to complete the 'Leave of Absence Exceptional Circumstances' request form. Letters will not be accepted. This form should be returned to the school office at least 15 school days before the start of the absence. A response will be sent to you as soon as possible. If leave is not authorised and you nevertheless withdraw your child from school, the absence will be recorded as unauthorised absence. There is now a national threshold of 10 unauthorised sessions (equivalent to 5 school days) within a rolling 10 school week period for when a penalty notice must be considered. Under the new rules, taking your child out of school for a one-week holiday will now mean that a penalty notice must be considered. Please note the legal information below:

If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £80 if paid within 21 days or £160 if paid after this but within 28 days.

If your child is further absent from school without authorisation within any 3-year period, you will be committing a further offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices for a second offence are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £160, payable within 28 days.

Importantly, fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, other action such as a parenting order or prosecution will be considered.

Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may also result in legal action. If you are prosecuted and attend court because your child has not been attending school, you could get a fine of up to £2,500. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs.

Absence not authorised by the school may also result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Again, Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs.

Money raised from fines is only used by the local authority to cover the costs of administering the system, and to fund attendance support. Any extra money is returned to the government.

'Parent' as set out in Section 576 of the Education Act 1996, defines parent to include: natural parents, whether they are married or not; any person or body who has parental responsibility for a child (as defined by the Children Act 1989) and; any person who, although not a natural parent, has care of a child. Having care of a child means a person with whom a child lives and who looks after a child, irrespective of what their relationship is with said child.

How is a Penalty Notice paid?

Penalty notices can be paid by card by calling the office on 01872 324201. If the 21st/28th day for payment falls on a weekend or bank holiday, payment will be accepted at the same rate on the following working day.

What happens if a Penalty Notice is not paid?

If a Penalty Notice is not paid within the 28 days of issue (as per the dates listed on the Penalty Notice), Comwall Council will progress the matter to the Magistrates' Court, for the offence of failing to ensure regular attendance, NOT for failure to pay the fine.

If found guilty:

- under section 444(1), it can result in the parent being fined up to £1000
- under section 444(1A), it can result in the parent being fined up to £2,500 and/ or receiving a custodial sentence of up to 3 months

Cornwall Council may also apply for costs incurred in taking the matter to court.

Penalty Notices

A guide to Education Welfare Services for parents and carers

What is a Penalty Notice?

A penalty notice is a fine that can be issued under section 444A and section 444B of the Education Act 1996. The fine is issued per parent, per child for:

- Leave of absence of 10 school sessions/5 days or more within any rolling 10 school week* period during term time, without authorisation from the school. This can include unauthorised absence for a holiday.
- Unauthorised absence of 10 or more sessions/5 days within any rolling 10 school week* period where a parent fails to provide an explanation for the absence, or where an explanation is provided but the school consider it insufficient to authorise the absence.
- Unauthorised lateness of 10 school sessions within any rolling 10 school week* period, whereby a child arrives at school after the registers have closed.

NB a penalty notice can be issued for any combination of the above reasons where there are 10 sessions/5 school days or more of unauthorised absence within any rolling 10 school week period. The unauthorised absence can be consecutive or non-consecutive and can span over two terms (including between academic years).

Or when

- A pupil is observed in a public place during school hours in the first five school days of a period of exclusion from school, without reasonable justification.
- * a school week is any week in which a school meets at least once.

Who can be issued with a Penalty Notice?

Parents and carers of a child can be issued with a Penalty Notice. The definition of a 'parent' as set out in section 576 of the Education Act 1996: By virtue of this section 'parent' includes: all natural parents, whether they are married or not; any person or body who has parental responsibility for a child (as defined by the Children Act 1989) and any person who, although not a natural parent, has care of a child. Having care of a child means a person who lives with and looks after a child, irrespective of what their relationship is with said child.

How much is a Penalty Notice fine?

As of the 19th of August 2024, a penalty notice is £80 if paid within 21 days. If the fine is not paid in 21 days, it will rise to £160 if paid within 28 days of being issued.

If a second penalty notice is issued to the same parent for the same child within a three-year rolling period, the fine will automatically rise to £160 with no option to pay the lower rate of £80.

If a parent then commits a third offence in a three-year rolling period, Cornwall Council will need to consider other enforcement optional options available. This could include prosecution under section 444(1) or section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996. If found guilty a parent would receive a criminal record and substantial fine

Penalty Notices are issued per parent, per child.

Therefore, if there are two parents and two children, the fines will total £320 if paid within 21 days or £640 if paid after 21 days but within 28 days (or for a second offence).

Can a Penalty Notice be paid in instalments?

No. Penalty Notices must be paid in full, within the designated dates. However, if a parent has more than one child and is therefore issued with more than one fine, they can pay the fines separately if they wish.

Who is responsible for issuing Penalty Notices?

It is a Headteacher's decision whether or not to authorise an absence and, if their decision is not to authorise, they have the right to request a Penalty Notice in line with their attendance policy process. Cornwall Council's role is to check that the evidence submitted is compliant with Cornwall Council's Code of Conduct for Education Related Penalty Notices and, if so, to issue as appropriate.

Can a parent appeal a Penalty Notice?

There is no statutory right of appeal once a Penalty Notice has been issued. If you believe that the Penalty Notice should not have been issued, you should make contact with the school or academy that your child attends at your very earliest convenience after receiving the Penalty Notice. If you wish to discuss the Penalty Notice procedure, you can contact Cornwall Council's Education Welfare Service on 01872 324298, or email educationwelfare@cornwall.gov.uk
